Dr. Marci Bowers, a pioneer in the transgender surgical field, is recognized as a leading voice in the field of transgender medicine. She travels nationally and internationally to teach practitioners about providing patient-centered care for transgendered people. Currently, Dr. Bowers operates a transgender surgical practice in San Mateo, Calif., where she performs 220 gender-related operations, annually. She is board certified by the American Board of Obstetrics & Gynecology and is listed among “America’s Best Physicians.” Dr. Bowers not only speaks as a seasoned, transgender surgeon, she also speaks about transgender life with the unique experience of being the first transsexual woman to perform gender reassignment surgeries in the United States.
